1.	FAITH THAT	IN THE PIT
	Genesis 37:23–24, 28	
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Faith doesn't always begin on a mountaintop — sometimes it begins in a pit.

- "They stripped him of his robe..." (verse 23)
- "They took him and threw him into the cistern..." (verse 24)
- "Sold... for twenty shekels of silver" (verse 28)

Sometimes, faith means saying:

God, I don't understand this—but I trust You're in it with me." He may not lift you out of the pit right away, but He never leaves you there alone.

They receive forgiveness. And even more powerfully — they hear Joseph say, "It was not you who sent me here, but God."

Faith doesn't just endure pain — it transforms it into purpose. Joseph's life gives us four powerful truths about faith:

- 1. Faith endures when life feels unfair.
- 2. Faith resists temptation when no one is watching.
- 3. Faith waits patiently when dreams are delayed.
- 4. Faith forgives when it would be easier to get even.
