	What patterns do you notice in how Jesus intentionally crosses cultural or social boundaries?
	How might these examples challenge the way you approach people who seem "outside" your comfort zone?
5.	Compare Luke 8:35 with 2 Corinthians 5:17 and Ephesians 2:1–10.
	How do these Scriptures together describe what it means to

be made new in Christ?
