The Letter of Philippians was:

**(1)** written by a man in prison | **(2)** to a church under pressure despite the circumstances | **(3)** it is one of the most joyful letters ever written.

The first church in Philippi started with

1. Businesswoman (and her family),
2. a former slave,
3. A Roman jailer.
