This scroll represents God's redemptive plan for history.

Notice the difference between Revelation 4 and Revelation 5.

- In Revelation 4, Heaven worships God because He is the **Creator** of all things.
- In Revelation 5, Heaven worships Jesus because He is the **Redeemer** of all things.
- The song of Revelation 4 celebrates **creation**.
- The song of Revelation 5 celebrates **redemption**.
